MARINE NOTES OF THE WORLD

SHIPWRECKED CREW Landed—STEAMER SUNK

Dangers to Navigation—Ferry and Barge Burned—Cargo Valuations—Harbor Front Notes—A New Steamer.

SHIPWRECKED CREW Landed.

Port Huron, Mich., April 22.—The crew of the steamship Uganda which encountered heavy ice and sank in the Straits of Mackinac Saturday night, arrived here today on board the steamship Donaldson, which took them off the sinking vessel. The steamship went down with 100,000 bushels of corn, bound from Milwaukee to Buffalo. The crew reported that after the Uganda received a bad cut by the ice she filled so rapidly that nothing could be accomplished with the pumps.

DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

New York, N. Y., April 22.—US str. Solace reports April 22, Barnest Lighthouse bearing 4 deg E (Mag) and Tucker Beach lighthouse bearing S 79 deg W (Mag) passed a large log about 3 feet square, standing upright and projecting about 3 feet out of water. US cruiser Montgomery reports April 17, about 10 miles SSW of Barnest, saw what appeared to be the deckhouse of a barge with a large wheel figure 1 on the side. Star Dredman reports April 15, lat 38 29 N, lon 74 35 W, passed close to a spar projecting about 2 feet out of water, apparently attached to submerged wreckage. Star Wells City reports April 13, lat 41 N, lon 69 20 W, passed a spar about 3 feet out of water, apparently attached to submerged wreckage. Apr. 10, lat 42 29 N, lon 45 25 W, passed a log about 60 feet long and 2 feet in diameter, partly covered with marine growth.


