Fishermen of Charlotte County Agree not to Sell to Dealers on the Other Side of the Border.

Eastwort. Me., Dec. 6—Canadian smoked fish dealers at Grand Manan and other places along the Canadian border in Charlotte County have entered into an agreement whereby no smoked fish are to be sold to any of the boneless smoked herring dealers on the American jide of the line.

This agreement is due to the fact that the business jis to be established at Grand Manan and on Deer Island. The reduction in duty now makes it possible for New Brunswick to put the fish up for the American market at a fair profit and at the same time furnish employment for a large number of Canadian border residents. The elimination of Canadian herring from those formerly available for the Maine packers will be felt so most of them believe.
