FOUND DEAD AFTER SENTENCE PRONOUNCED

John Bull Makes Sensational Announcement of Strange Body in Ireland.

London, Feb. 6.—The Sunday Telegram, owned by Herbert W. Boston, editor of John Bull, today asserts the existence of a third party in Ireland, concerning itself with executing justice, according to its own views, on any persons who commit alleged crimes and escape punishment.

The newspaper says the party is styled "the middle party" and that it meets frequently. Its headquarters is in Northwall where there are conferences with military officers of high standing.

Cruise Along Coast.

During May and June, before departing for the far north Dr. MacMillan plans to make an exhibition cruise along the coast. With a party of six men he will sail from Boston about July 1, and conditions being favorable, expects to reach Fury and Hecla Strait early in September.

On his Crocker Land Expedition.

which consumed four years (1913-1917) Dr. MacMillan disproved the theory of the existence of a Crocker Land in the extreme North, and also discovered nine new islands, and explored and mapped 500 miles of coast line.

CAN SECURE ALCOHOL FROM SAW-MILL WASTE

Possible to Extract Twenty-Five Gallons from Ton of the Waste.

There is a world-wide shortage of grain alcohol for power and industrial use. This is due to under-production of alcohol and to the shortage of grain in Europe. The wholesale price in Canada is double what it was a year ago, and in all probability will go higher.

Big Shortage.

The Dominion Research Council has advised that the title distilleries of Canada be turned to the production of alcohol, satisfactory returns had been made for at least a decade, these having a capacity of about eight million proof gallons.

Chemical Process.

Grain alcohol can be obtained by chemical treatment of wood, which is being consumed daily in the burners attached to the sawmills along this coast. The quantity of material so treated is enormous, amounting in B. C. to several thousand tons daily in ordinary running.

Empire is On Basis of Full Partnership


