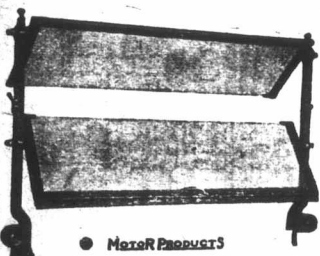

#### The Hydro Meeting.

A goodly number of ratepayers attended the Hydro meeting in the town hall on Thursday night of last week, when Mr. Iler, engineer of the Hydro-Electric Power Commission, was present and explained in detail all the clauses and provisions of our proposed contract for electric power, in the event that the Hydro By-Law passes on the 15th of next month.

Mr. Iler set at rest the rumor in circulation around town, to the effect that nearly all the present wired buildings would have to be re-wired if Hydro was installed, stating that it was an absolute falsehood, as the Hydro service would connect up with all the present wired buildings without question, and that we are at present under the same regulations exactly as we will be under Hydro.

The Hydro Commission had estimated the cost of a direct line from Healy Falls to Havelock, and found that it would be far more expensive than the contemplated service in conjunction with Norwood, from the tie line that is being constructed to Peterboro. He explained the reason of the difference in rates from Norwood, as being directly due to a matter of geography, and that we had to pay the fixed charges on the service line of five and a half miles to Norwood, which made up the difference of \$6.00 per horse power for our requirements. But he also quoted Norwood's rates, showing that while Norwood had a small advantage in the rate to power consumers, that Havelock had a greater advantage in our domestic rate, which by the way, is the largest source of revenue in either place, and that Havelock was practically on an equal basis with Norwood thereby.

All present at the meeting were apparently unanimous in their desire for the proposed Hydro system, and present indications are that the By-Law to be voted on on the 15th of January next, will be carried by a very large majority.

A copy of the recently issued annual report of the Hydro system throughout Ontario, has been received by the Clerk, and is at the disposal of any ratepayer who may wish to examine it, and compare prices and statistics, which are very minute and plainly expressed.

#### Sir Robt. Borden To Continue As Prime Minister.

Yielding to the urgings of his Cabinet colleagues and of many other persons outside the Government, Sir Robt. Borden has consented not to act upon previous decision that for his health's sake he would be compelled to resign the Premiership early in the new year. He has agreed to "stick," to make arrangements for the discharge by another of his duties for an indefinite period, and to seek during that time such restoration of his former vigor as may enable him to return to them.
