

Man gets 10 years after violent robbery

A 26-year-old man who has spent only 22 days out of prison in the past 11 years, has been sentenced to 10 years in penitentiary for a robbery in which he stabbed his victim in the throat.

Leif Jensen of Brampton had only been free three days when he broke into a house. He confronted the homeowner, who was watching television in the basement recreation room. Jensen stabbed him in the throat with a knife he had picked up while searching the kitchen. He hit the man with a chair and fled. The victim has recovered.

Assistant crown attorney Tony Williams told court that Jensen's lengthy criminal record required a lengthy penitentiary term.

Jensen has escaped from custody three times while serving sentences in British Columbia and the United States. He left home at 15 to travel with an exhibition and has had 22 days freedom on

probation since then.

Defense lawyer John Smith asked for a reformatory term, which means a maximum sentence of two years, because Jensen's record indicated imprisonment for him was not a deterrent.

Smith believes the federal government is "not paying enough attention to behaviour modification, except for the

mentally ill." Psychiatric reports indicate Jensen is sane, and that his "anti-social behaviour appears to be genetically determined." One report said he is "potentially very dangerous."

Smith argued there are no mental health facilities to deal with cases in which offenders are violent, but not insane.

Two get bail

A man and woman, charged with importing \$25,000 worth of hashish, have been released on bail following a hearing in Peel provincial court.

Suzanne Huard, 26, of Fort Rouge, Man., and David Muir, 22, of Hamilton were charged after five pounds of liquid hashish were found in leather carrying bags during a customs search at Toronto International Airport at Malton. The couple had arrived on a flight from Britain.

Muir had left on a trip for India in January and was arrested on his return to the airport May 18, constable Bob Sherrin of the RCMP Mississauga drug squad told court.

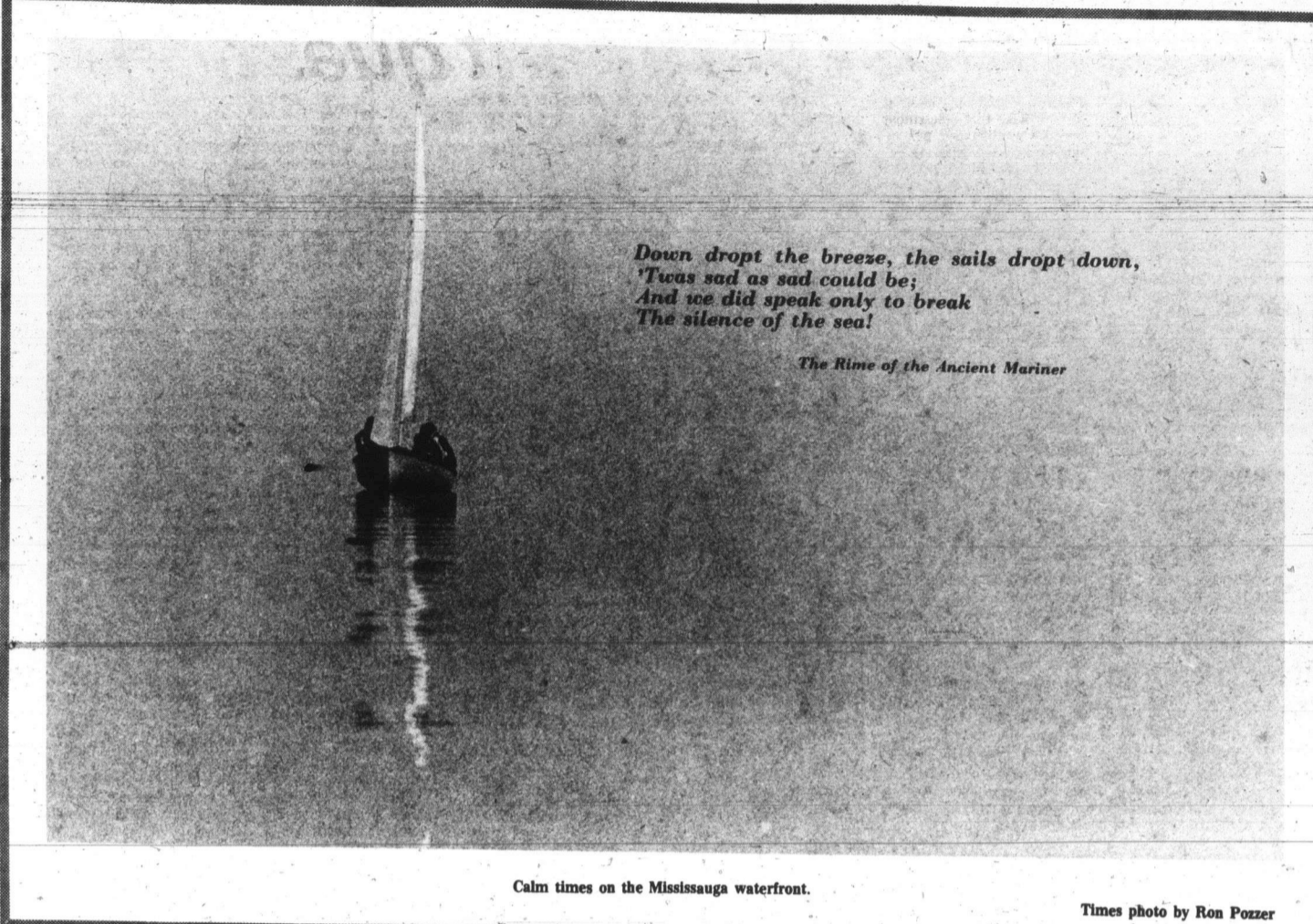
Bail was set at \$15,000.

Streetsville marks its founding on June 7

Here comes the bread-honey fest

The founding of the community of Streetsville in 1820 will be celebrated once again on Saturday, June 7 at the third annual Streetsville Founders' Bread and Honey Festival.

The festival, to be held on a natural amphitheatre of 30 acres on the banks of the Credit River, will open with the unveiling of a plaque by the descendants of the

founding families. The plaque will commemorate the Ontario government's designation of the former town a year ago as an historic site.

Official ceremonies are at 10:30 a.m.

Among other things at the festival, there will be a Six Nation Indian village, a look into the past through a display by the surrounding Historical

Societies, a gallery of crafts, carnival rides, beer and tea gardens, a fish derby, bread-baking contests and an eight-band parade.

The parade, organized by Frank Haddon, will start from Canada Brick Dr. to the park via Britannia and Queen and will feature 122 Kiwanis Cavaliers and St. Andrew's Drum and Bugle Corps, the 1974 Junior E Champions of Canada.

Three trophies and prize money will be awarded to the three top floats.

Horseshoe-pitching, bait-casting and log-sawing will suit the hardier types, while the Rotary Tent will offer refreshments to those who'd rather sit and watch the fun.

A highlight of the day will be a free slice of local bread, with honey, courtesy of McCarthy Milling and Reid Milling, Streetsville's Mrs. Jack will bake in a specially-built outdoor brick oven of locally-made bricks about 100 years old.

The bread theme derives from the time when Timothy Street started the first flour mill in the area. With the growth of many small apiaries in the area, honey was added to the theme.

The festival originated through the Promotion Committee of the Town of Streetsville in 1973. The first festival, under the auspices of the Streetsville Chamber of Commerce, was such a success that it was slated as an annual event and became incorporated in 1974.

This year's pageantry will also include the Queen's Own Rifles Pioneer Group, a group of Highland Dancers, the Upper-Canada Rifles in their buckskins and flintlock rifles and a musical ride (similar to the RCMP's) by a group of young women.

Free bus service will be provided from all parking areas to the festival grounds. Picnic areas abound on

Two men were sitting in the beverage room of the Dundas St. E. tavern when a third man sat down at their table uninvited, police said. He didn't know them and was asked to leave, but refused.

He finally left when asked to

about five feet, 10 inches, with shoulder-length hair. The investigation continues.

Teacher and wife charged with fraud

Fraud squad detectives have arrested a community college teacher and his wife at Square One after a stolen credit card was used to buy men's clothing, cigarette lighters, pant suits and dresses.

Ants Kalljuve, 35, of 25 Abbeywood Trail in Toronto has been charged with four counts of fraud and one count of personation. He is a teacher at Centennial College in Scarborough. His wife, Elaine, 29, of the same address, faces 13 counts of fraud, one count of attempted fraud, and one count of personation.

Police said goods were obtained at the Dixie Plaza, Sherway Gardens, Cloverdale Mall, East Mall and other shopping plazas in Mississauga and Toronto, using a stolen Master Charge card. The total value was about \$240.

A suspicious employee checked the card when it was presented at a Square One store, and contacted the fraud squad. The couple was arrested by detectives Jim Craig and Bill McKee, and released on a promise to appear in court June 3.
