Sir,

I am directed by His Excellency the
Lieut. Governor to acquaint you that His Majesty's
Receiver General will forward to Brantford the amount
of the dividends due to the Indians of the Six Nations
for the last year, being the interest of their property
vested in the British funds for that period and that it
will be paid to the Chiefs entitled to receive their several
portions on ^{the 22nd} instant.

I am also to observe that in future
the Trustees will be prepared to pay the dividends
arising from the money of the Indians of the Six Nations
vested in the British funds, half yearly as soon as
they become due.
