What was the name of the French Canadian officer who wrote to Hughes asking to raise and lead a French Canadian regiment?

Also if possible send me the exact number of farmer conscripts and the number of others. I have the total but I would like if possible to get the number of farmers or farmers' sons taken under The Military Service Act. So, if possible, please supply me with this information right away.

I called up at your office two or three times when I was down at the Convention but you were out, and when I saw you in the Hall you were busy.
