Ottawa 19th February, 1902.

Sir,

I beg to inform you that Dr Jules Constantin of Pointe Bleue, has been appointed regular medical attendant to the Indians of the Pointe Bleue Reserve (Montagnais and all other Indians resident or sojourning at Pointe Bleue) at a salary of \$500.00. The Department also has appointed Dr E.A. Claveau, of Chicoutimi, a regular medical officer. The latter will be paid a salary of \$200.00, for which he will have to attend all the Indians of Chicoutimi and vicinity. Both gentlemen have been told that they will be expected to render all medical and surgical attendance required by the Indians respectively assigned to their care and also to attend in any cases brought to their notice by you. They have also been told that they are expected to furnish all medicines required, and to supply substitutes should they at any time be unable to attend to the duties of their office.

Both appointments will date from the 1st March, and the salaries will be paid quarterly. You should make requisition on the regular pay-list forms for payment of salary at the end of each quarter.

You should advise any other Doctors whose accounts you have been in the habit of certifying of the above appointments, and that hereafter their services will not be paid for by the Department, should not therefore certify any accounts from them.
