



Ottawa, October 1, 1914.

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th instant, No. 637-9, in regard to lighthouse site comprising 2 acres at Cape Mudge, on Valdes Island, forming part of the Laich-kivil-tach Indian Reserve, No. 10 and in reply to say that this site was acquired by the Marine & Fisheries Department for lighthouse purposes under the provisions of the 35th section of the Indian Act, as amended by section 5 of Chapter 35 of 50-51 Vic., under authority of Order in Council of the 6th of January, 1900, payment having been made therefor at the rate of \$15.00 per acre, amounting to \$30.00, which sum was duly placed to the credit of the Laich-kivil-tach Cape Mudge Indians. I may say that the Department has no information as to the enlargement of the ground for fog horn plant.
