I was walking down the main road outside the R.A.S.C.
Serjeants' wess when I was attacked by four men. There
were no words and no arguments; they just beat me up
and left me on the ground. It was dark and the
approximate time was 2335 hrs, 19th Aug., 1943. I now
recognize these men, pointed out to me as the accused
as being my assailants. I did see the flash Airborne
Canada under their shoulder straps.
