Trap-line: NASS, Tommy, Telegraph Creek, B.C.

The alteration to McClusky Family's trap-line, suggested in your favour of April 4th, 1940, your file 112/12/N/4944, can not be considered.

There is no necessity for such alteration, as by making application for Tommy Nass' two areas, as at present registered, and including the Thomas Bryan area, if same is cancelled, in the new application, Tommy Nass will have one trap-line area, which will be acceptable to this Department.

This method of applying for registration was fully set out in previous correspondence, and I would be pleased if you would be so kind as to institute immediate steps to have this application submitted without delay, lest Thomas Bryan disposes of his trap-line area, which he has a right to do under our regulations, and thereby defeat all my endeavours on Tommy Nass' behalf.

Your co-operation in this matter will be greatly appreciated.
