

St. Peter's Cemetery

THIS Burial Ground was consecrated in 1871, and has become the resting place of many of the original members of the congregation. It is in charge of a committee consisting of Mr. W. A. O. Morson and Mr. J. O. Hyndman. In order to keep the grounds in proper condition it is necessary to have a caretaker in daily attendance during the spring and summer. To meet the cost of this expenditure the committee asks those who own graves to pay two dollars per season for each such grave. For this amount (which should be paid into the church) the grass is cut on and around the graves, and the paths kept in good order. Extra work,

such as re-sodding, cleaning headstones, etc., must be arranged for with the caretaker.

The committee suggests the wisdom of forming an endowment fund for the cemetery. Legacies at the rate of fifty dollars per grave would yield sufficient interest to keep it in order in perpetuity. Two legacies have recently been received for this purpose. Unless some such provision is made for their care, there is danger lest the graves become entirely neglected when families die out or leave the Province.
