- 37. All fees heretofore paid for registration under the "Medical Act," by resolution, order, regulation, or by-law of the Council, or otherwise, are hereby declared to rave been lawfully imposed and exacted, and to form part of the funds of the Council. 56 Vic., c. 27, s. 4.

Offences and Penalties.

- 38. Any person entitled to be registered under this Act, but who neglects or omits to be so registered, shall not be entitled to any of the rights or privileges conferred by registration under the provisions of this Act, so long as such neglect or omission continues, and he shall be liable to all the penalties imposed by this Act or any other Act in force against unqualified or unregistered practitioners. 1886, c. 13, s. 33.
- 39. If the Registrar makes or causes to be made any wilful falsification in any matter relating to the register, he shall incur a penalty of fifty dollars, and shall be disqualified from again holding that position. 1886, c. 13, s. 34.
- 40. If any person procures, or causes to be procured, his registration under this Act by means of any false or fraudulent representation or declaration, either verbally or in writing, it shall be lawful for the Registrar upon
