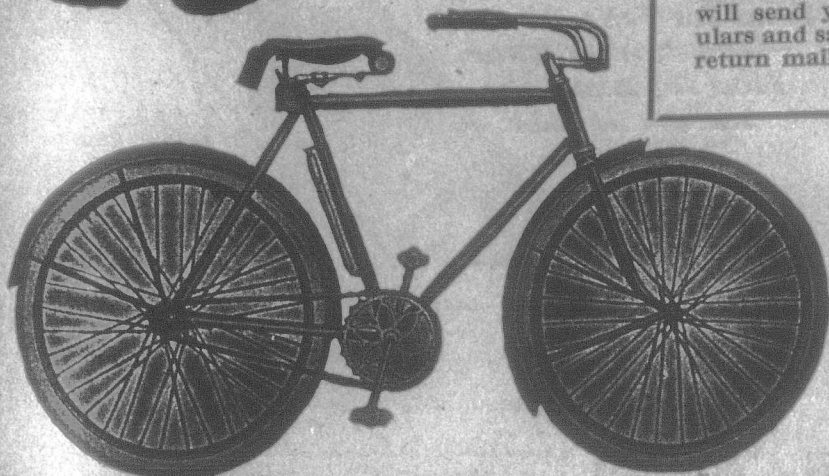
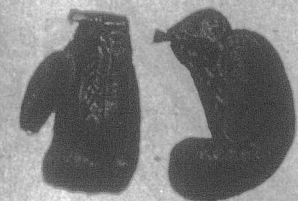
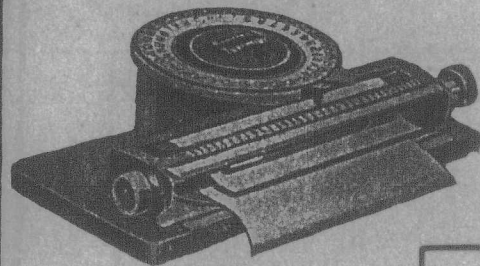
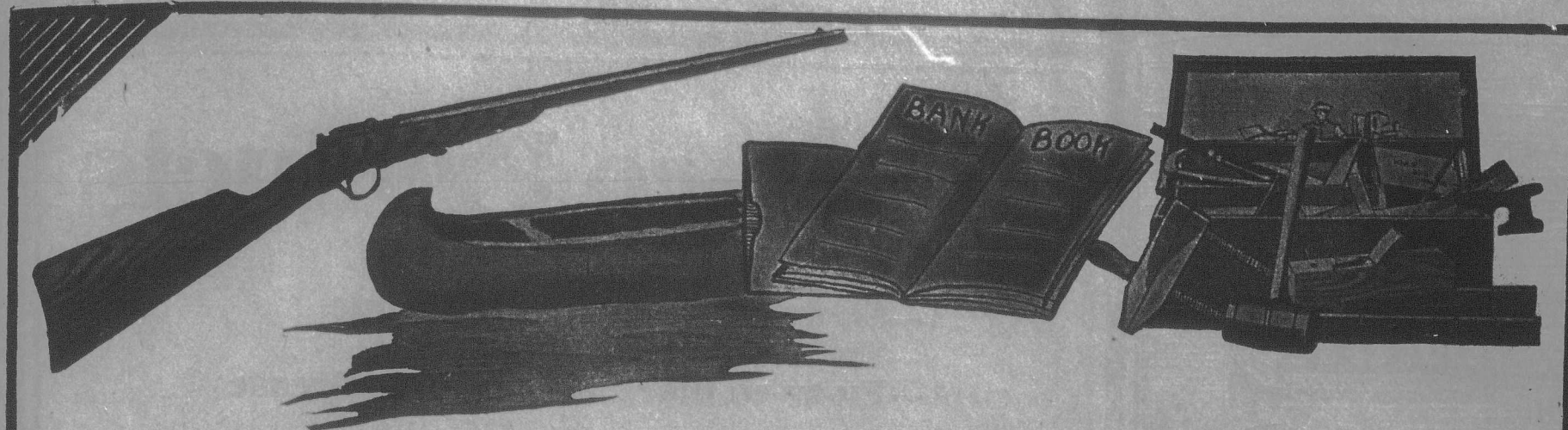
Messrs. Martindale write that their bulls are doing well; but they have no more for sale at present.

Shires and Shorthorns at Maple Leaf Farm.

Maple Leaf Farm, the property of Mr. J. C. Martindale, Hampton P.O., only a short distance north of the station of Solina on the C. N. R., Toronto and Ottawa line, is noted for its Shorthorn and Shropshire flock, and is one of the best and most productive farms in the county of Durham. The Shorthorn and Shropshires, at present, as represented by a representative of this paper, once more compare favorably with Ontario's best, and the present offering in both lines furnish prospective buyers an opportunity of getting a choice individuality and breeding. The females represented among the Shorthorns are Louisas, Missies, Minnie Linds, over which has been a good record. Lavender-bred son of Sultan. Shires and Leicesters at Willowbanks.

It is perhaps not one Shorthorn in Eastern Canada to day who has been in these columns from week to week who is not quite familiar with the least of the Willowbanks herd of Shorthorns owned by Jas. C. Martindale of Caledonia. Sixty years of experience in breeding and selecting as a case in this herd, has not been in vain. To-day, as many of our readers already know, the Douglas herd is prominently amongst Canada's best and it is doubtful if there are three herds in the whole Dominion where a lot of matrons make up one herd. The families are, with few exceptions, all straight Scotch, and include a number of the more fashionable of to-day. At present there is an especially strong line-up of two-year-old heifers from these dams and the former senior sire in service at Willowbanks, Roan Chief. Impurely one of these heifers is strong for many of the heavier export and they are all forward in the present herd sire and show well. Both Roan Chief and the other are sires that are too well known among Canadian breeders to need further comment, and this should be of interest to many who are searching the country over for females that are really first class. Mr. Douglas' offering of bulls, although nearly all are sired by him, are in ages from six to twelve months and were at the time of our last showing excellent show form as well as good individuals. They must be to be best appreciated in the present offering is comprised of ram and ewe lambs, although a few importation Mr. Douglas is offering four shearling rams and two ewes, all bred by Thomas Fogandenny, Scotland, and in particular are quite a little better than ordinary. The lambs mentioned are all home-bred, but are all sired by imported sires and ewes.
