or him upon the same trusts, and for the same ends, intents and purposes, and be applied and disposed of in the same way and manner as are by this Act declared, of the moneys which may arise from the sale or sales, mortgage or mortgages of the lands, tenements and hereditaments by this Act authorized to be sold and mortgaged as aforesaid.

Right of Mrs. Thompson to dower, &c., not to be affected.

5. Nothing in this Act contained shall prejudice or deprive, or be construed to prejudice or deprive the said Lucretia Williams Thompson of any right, title or interest she now has or may have in or to dower of and in the lands and hereditaments aforesaid.

Conditions upon which Charles Thompson, the son, may become a Trus-

6. The powers and interests herein given to the said George Penny Dickson and John Coleman Griffith for the purposes in this Act expressed, shall be shared in and jointly executed with them by the said Charles Thompson, the son of the said testator, whenever under the provisions of the codicil to the Will of the said testator, his said son shall become a trustee of the property of the said testator, and accept probate of the said Will and codicil; And in order to constitute the said Charles Thompson a co-trustee with the said George Penny Dickson and John Coleman Griffith, for the purposes of this Act, no conveyance, assurance or device shall be necessary or requisite beyond the performance of the conditions set forth in the Will of the said testator, and the acceptance of probate of the said Will and codicil by the said Charles Thompson, the son; whereupon, but not till then, he shall, for all the purposes of this Act, be a joint trustee with the said George Penny Dickson New Trustees. and John Coleman Griffith, for the purposes of this Act; And every new trustee to be hereafter appointed under the provisions of the Will of the said testator or otherwise, to act in the performance of the trusts of his said Will, shall, from and after such appointment, be also trustee with the continuing of other trustees, if any, of the said Will, for the purpose of carrying into effect the ends, interests and purposes of this Act, and no conveyance, assurance or device shall be necessary to effectuate such appointments to the trusteeship for the purposes of this Act.

7. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
