"appropriated for erecting the faid Common Gaul, as a compensation, for his services during the construction of the said Gaul."

Mr. Viger moved, in amendment to the Bill, seconded by Mr. Larue;

That after the word "direct," in the fixteenth line of the fifth Clause, all the other words, to the end of the Clause, to be lest out.

Mr. Papineau, junior, moved, feconded by Mr. Blouin;

That the confideration of the said motion be postponed 'till to-morrow.

The House divided on the question:

Yeas 5 Nays 14

So it passed in the negative.

The main question being put, the House again divided:

Yeas 15 Nays 4

So it was carried in the affirmative, and

ORDERED, accordingly.

Mr. Coffin now moved, seconded by Mr. Bell:

That the Bill, as amended, be engroffed.

The House divided upon the question:

Yeas 15 Nays 4

So it was carried in the affirmative, and

ORDERED, accordingly.
