



In the Navy They Weigh A. Ton

The Observer saw yesterday one of the big castings for the heavy shells which are to be manufactured by Pembroke's newest joint stock company, the Pembroke Iron Works, in the Lee foundry. This casting weighs about 150 pounds, but when finished the shell will weigh 90 pounds, so that there is really about 60 pounds trimmed off. It is, however, a terrible projectile, and when it is considered that this shell, loaded, will be hurled through space a distance of twenty miles, if necessary, on its errand of destruction, some idea of the frightfulness of modern war can be formed .- Pembroke Ob-
