

ELECTION REFORM BILL COMES UP THURSDAY

It Will Go Into Committee Without Any Further Obstruction.

Conservatives Will Move Many Amendments—House Made Rapid Progress With Manitoba Land Bill and Civil Service Bill Yesterday—Both Will Be Finished Today.

OTTAWA, June 29.—When the election bill comes up again for discussion on Thursday Messrs. Claude Macdonnell and Alcorn will move to have incorporated in the bill the provisions contained in their bills to amend the election act as introduced in the Commons some months ago.

Mr. Macdonnell's amendment provides for a public holding of every election day so as to insure ample opportunity for every voter to exercise his franchise.

Mr. Alcorn's bill is a voluminous one, containing in part some of the provisions contained in the Aylesworth bill along with other provisions respecting the issuing of instructions to returning officers, tampering with ballots and ballot boxes. In case of some of the provisions which are analogous to both bills Mr. Alcorn will move to have clauses as drafted in his bill substituted for the clauses in the government measure. Thus in respect to contributions of corporations to campaign funds, when the Aylesworth bill provides for a fine of \$1,000 or two years imprisonment in case of any director, agent or shareholder who makes or permits such contribution, Mr. Alcorn would substitute the clause in his bill laying in addition a fine of \$5,000 on the corporation and making imprisonment compulsory.

Dr. Roche and Mr. Lancaster have each given notice of motion to strike out clause one of the Aylesworth bill, although at the same time no alternative clause is suggested to meet the admitted defect in the present law respecting the allocation of the voters lists in overlapping provincial and federal constituencies in Manitoba.

When the bill comes up for its second reading Mr. Borden has promised the opposition will allow it to go to the committee stage, where the various clauses will be discussed on their merits and the obstruction tactics previously pursued will not be renewed.

AUTO CLUB'S CLIMB INCENSES FARMERS

Resent Having Fine Macadam Highway Shut Off from Travel

COLLEGEVILLE, Pa., June 29.—Farmers of Lower Providence township, Montgomery county, are indignant at the action of the Northampton Automobile Club, which has arranged to take complete possession of the Ridge pike during its hill-climbing contest tomorrow.

The highway was macadamized two years ago at great expense by the Lower Providence taxpayers. The farmers of the section have watched with a growing irritation the tendency among auto owners to make the expensive road a speeding ground. They maintain that the thoroughfare is being ruined, and that they will have to foot the bill.

When it was intimated that the famous Skipjack hill was to be used in a hill-climbing contest, a movement was started to make some sort of an organized demonstration. It has, however, been learned that the members of the state constabulary troop stationed at Reading have been through the road during the races Saturday afternoon.

Lower Providence farmers have become doubly indignant since they have been informed that they will be shut off from their own road.

JUSTICE DOWLING DENIES APPLICATION OF HARRY K. THAW

NEW YORK, June 29.—Justice Dowling of the supreme court, who presided at the second trial of Harry K. Thaw, denied today Thaw's application to be removed from the asylum for the criminal insane at Matteawan to some other institution on the ground that Thaw was a dangerously insane person, not to be punished, but to be kept under restraint, that he might not injure himself or anyone else.

CONDITIONS IN DEMOCRATIC CAMP

No Change in Vice-Presidential Situation

Governor George E. Chamberlain of Oregon Named Yesterday

DENVER, Colo., June 29.—The fight over the anti-injunction plank in the Democratic platform is not the only struggle in which the committee on resolutions and possibly the convention itself may be involved.

It developed today that the prohibition question is to be brought to the front and that a desperate effort will be made to have a plank declaring its favor placed in the platform. The prohibition movement will be headed by General James M. Weaver of Iowa, who demanded of the recent Democratic convention of that state that it declare in favor of prohibition. General Weaver and his followers were not successful in their efforts in their own state, but not daunted by their failure have made arrangements to bring the matter up before the Democratic national convention. They claim, moreover, to have strong backing from a number of delegations from the southern states, which have recently passed prohibition laws, and it is declared confidently by General Weaver's adherents that if the Democratic national platform does not contain a prohibition plank it will be a matter which is under careful consideration. It is said to be the desire of Mr. Bryan to consult as many of the prominent members of the party as possible before any final action in formulating this resolution is taken.

The vice-presidential situation remains to all appearances just where it was yesterday, although the boom of Lieutenant Governor Chanler, of New York, seems to have weakened somewhat and his name is not as prominently mentioned as it was two days ago. This is largely due to the announcement made by Norman E. Black, candidate from New York, that the New York official is well qualified to take "second place on the ticket."

Only one new name was mentioned today as a vice-presidential possibility. This was Governor George E. Chamberlain, of Oregon. He is in much favor with some of the party leaders and it is said he will be personally acceptable to Mr. Bryan if the latter is nominated.

The sponsors of the vice-presidential boom located outside of New York state claim to be generally encouraged by the fact that the party leaders have been mentioned as aspirants to the nomination.

They believe with the New York delegation divided among the names of Chanler, E. M. Sippel, was in the chair, and among those present were J. N. Reilly, secretary; Rev. Neil McLaughlin, Rev. Squires, Mrs. Porter of W. C. T. U., C. N. Stockford and R. H. Coker.

WEDDING PARTY JOKER INDICTED FOR ASSAULT

Drew Revolver on Guests and Made Them Step Lively

COLOMBIA, S. C., June 29.—The grand jury of Lexington County has indicted N. Rogers Bayly for assault, with intent to kill, and carrying concealed weapons, the indictment growing out of an incident which happened last year. A wedding party, composed of A. J. Bethea, Governor Ansel's private secretary, Professor W. C. Allen, the Rev. J. L. Allen and W. W. Page, the complainants, was at Batesburg, stopping at the Batesburg Hotel. Apparently without motive, Bayly entered their apartment, and drawing his pistol ordered them around the room in summary fashion. At first the members of the wedding party thought their assailant was insane, but when it dawned upon them that they were treated thus by a man in his senses they grew angry and protested. Bayly then left the room, and going to the lobby where the party had engaged carriages, he told the proprietor that he had intended the wedding party out of town, and there was no use longer to hold the carriages for them. Acting upon this information, the lively man let the carriages out to other people, and the wedding party was seriously inconvenienced.

Resenting such conduct the members of the wedding party sought redress from the authorities, but could obtain none. They then took the matter up with the grand jury, their efforts resulting in the indictment of Bayly.

Bayly is said to have regarded the affair as a practical joke of some cleverness, but his victims take an altogether different view of it, and will sue him for damages. Bayly's case has been continued, and he is out on bond, one of his sureties being W. C. Bates, mayor of Batesburg.
