Lee will follow when the trail is developed. Col. Snyder states that the principal of the three Indians whom Capt. Lee was sant to arrest is a desperate character. He has about eight or ten others with him, and Gol. Snyder believes that they will have to be hunted down.

Another Crank Tumps From Brooklys Bridge.

C. P. R. MATTERS. Tosorro, Aug. 3. The Empire's special cable says: "The Pacific mail subsidy question was settled today between Sir Charles Tupper and the chancellor of the exchequer. It will be remembered as subsidy from Goschen nearly a year ago and it was more than once feared that the negotiations would entirely fall through, owing to the many obtaicles, but the matter is now finally sattled. A contract between the Imperial government and the company will be made immediately, granting an annual imperial subsidy of £45,000 in adding Kong for ten years. It is expected the mail service will be commenced in about a year."

The Globe's Montreal special says: "It is stated on presumably good authority that Sir George Stephen, who is about to visit England, will not again return and that be proposes to resign the presidency of the Canadian Pacific railway. It is questioned who will succeed him, Sir Donald Smith's health being so prescrious. Van Horne's name is mentioned in connection with the probable reconstruction of the company upon an American basis. One story has it that other prominent men are about to leave the company and an altogether rew deal is not improbable."
