Widow Makes a Gallant Defence—The Bathfis Compelled to Betreat Five Times. DUBLIN, Aug. 30.—Evictions on the O'Grardy estates at Herbertstown began to-day. Bailiffs were re-inforced by 100 soldiers and 300 policemen. All the houses occupied by the tenants were barricaded and guarded for defence. The house of Mrs. Crimmins, a widow, was first advanced upon by the bailiffs. The widow and her friends were well armed with paving stones and boiling water and both were showered upon the bailiffs with such telling effect that they were repulsed no less than four times. The sheriff's men in their attacks attempted to crowbar their way through the walls and roof, and Mrs. Crimmins had scalding water poured over their heads, faces and necks. After the fourth repulse of the bailiffs the police attempted to storm the house. They also were driven back. Finally a joint rush was made by bailiffs, and police and the house was broken into and captured. It was found that the defenders of the widow's habitation numbered nine persons, five men and four women. All were taken prisoners. A large crowd had collected about the house to witness the contest.
