of the tide are allowed to catch and soil as many as they can, and they do catch from thirty to a hundred to our one and why should we not be allowed to do the same, when as I said before we are living so far from the real spawning ground.

I have not the least doubt that when the whole case is brought fairly before the "Fishery Department" in its proper form that we then will receive due justice.

I would asy more but space will not per mit at present, as I have already taken up so much of your space. By inserting the above in your paper, you will confer a favour upon the inhabitants of the Restigouche in general and your correspondent in particular.
