Rescue of the Eira's Crew.

London, August 20.—The steamer Hope, commanded by Sir Allen Young, which left here in June last in search of the crew of the steamer Eira, has arrivthe crew of the steamer Eira, has arrived at Peterhead with the entire crew of that vessel. The Hope picked them up in Matotahkin Straits, Nova Zembla, on 3rd August, they having lost their ship off Franz Josef Land and jurneyed in boats to the straits through the ice. Leigh Smith, commander of the Eira Expedition, gives the following account of its experience:—On July 13, 1881, we of its experience: -On July 13, 1881, we steamed through packice, and ten days later sighted Franz Josef Land. We proceeded towards Cape Ludlow, which was close to a pack to the northward. On Aog. 21, 1881, we went up Nightingale Sound and thence to Eira harbor, and erected the storehouse. On the 16th true love." we started east to look for the Jeannette but were unable to pass Berentzhook. On August 21st the Eira got blocked between a land floe and pack of ice, a mile time no signs of scurvy appeared. Twenty-nine walrus and thirty-six bears were killed and eaten. We left Cape Flora on June 4, 1882, in four boats; sailed 80 miles without seeing any ice; reached Nova Zembla, Aug. 2nd. When the Eira was nipped, the leak gained so rapidly that two hours after it was discovered it was necessary to abandoned the ship. Hardly had the last man left the vessel when the ice eased and the Eira rapidly sunk. A tent was first erected on the ice, and a house subsequently built. All the boats of the Eira were saved. Most of the men saved some clothes and bedding. For sixteen nights the men slept in a tent, from which they were at times almost flosted
