COMMITTED SUICIDE FOR Evening Leaving the girl whom he brought into a restaurant near Lawrence market, last night, Ferd and Rheaume, aged 19, went to second floor, wrote on a paper he committing suicide because of love of the girl, then toppled down stairs in a dying condition from a dose of carbolic acid. Less than a half hour later he was dead.

"In a few minutes I will be dead, because of my-love of Amelia Fauvelle," he wrote on the paper and then signed his name.

The young man was formerly. waiter, but lately had been working as a common laborer at anything he could get. He was boarding at 608 Cartier street.

It was about nine o'clock last night that he and the girl entcred the New England Cafe at 14 St. Lawrence Market Square. After a meal of chop suev and cake, he went up to the cashier and asked for a piece of paper to write upon. It was given him and he ascended to the second floor. After waiting a few moments the girl started to leave the place without him, but just as she was going out the door he heard her departure and started down the flight of stairs. The poison he had swallowed took effect very quickly and he collapsed at the bottom of the steps, the bottle plainly labelled carbolic acid. by his side. 




