RIGHT TIME WITH BLOOD

Correspondents' Headquarters, Monday, May 1.—The Germans are quiet in their lines since they repulsed so utterly in their attack against Scherpenberg and our round Ypres. Even their guns are not very active last night and they are burying their dead, back their wounded and taking broken divisions out of line to send them with fresh troops for battle.

During the night the British believe that will happen, because the enemy has Kemmel Hill, a position to seize the three hills is predominant, and there is no doubt that he will again risk the loss of a political point of view Ypres is a lure to him, and there is a great blowing of trumpets if their troops could capture that city of the salient, which as a British army in this war.

Will Exact a Bloody Toll.

That the French are with us to strengthen our defensive power, which sustained such furious onslaughts over 100 German divisions since weeks ago, the next battle in Flanders may not give the enemy any further ground than the day before yesterday, which was nothing at all, and certain, anyhow, that not a yard will be yielded until the next day. The German soldiers have paid great sums of life.

The last battle two additional divisions have now been identified as being put in against the British in Flanders, one being the 117th "Vorwerksele, and the other the Guards Division including the "Cockshotters" whom the Welsh regiments shattered at last year and who have fought us in the Cambrai salient.
