a message or a favorite quotation, or paste a snapshot onto each leaf. This means a lot of work but it is one of the gifts that any shut-in enjoys most because it is a daily interest through the year.

Short stories from magazines which she has especially enjoyed and has cut out and bound in brown paper covers. Serials from magazines collected and treated in the same way.

A book of snapshots of those of the invalids, friends and relatives whom she is not often able to see.

The latest thing in puzzles.

A sunshine calendar, which is a calendar gotten out for people interested in the weather, and is so arranged that by sticking on little stickers of various colors (supplied with the calendar) one can keep a record of the amount of sunshine and be able to confute those people who are always saying the sun hasn't shined for a whole week.

A passporting outfit.
