 All ports of call to Holton and from Grady to Holton. Schooner "Stone", Reuter Wiseman, reports a heavy jam of ice 10 miles south of Cape Harrison, and had to retreat to Indian Harbor. At Snug Harbor, Occasional Harbor, Fishing Ship Harbor the first sign of fish was had yesterday. A half ton of fish were taken at French Harbor. At French Harbor there is no sign with jiggers. No sign of fish. Twenty schooners north of the harbor. At Lark Harbor, Belle eleven schooners average 50 fish.

"We do not consider this movement a risk. I have given closest study to the relations between young women in business and their male superiors. It is my honest conviction—and the absolute belief of every member allied with me in this understanding—that the modern young business woman is doing more for the advancement of many men to-day than are their pampered and petted wives at home.

"We are dedicating this organization not only to the uplift of conditions among working women and the improvement of morals among working girls, but we intend, in many instances, to give to our male superiors, our bosses, that degree of honest service in the performance of certain domestic functions which they never get from their wives at home.

"How often have we seen husbands come to work in the morning, moody, morose, unshaven, and unkempt? How often have we seen them come in after breakfast, unable to give their best to their work? How often have we seen them on the verge of collapse because their wives have neglected them?"

"The modern young woman of the business world is actually doing more today to shape the destinies of her boss than his own wife who is stationed in luxury and ease at home. She thinks only of bridge and dance and dancing and the pursuit of pleasure. The business woman, keen-minded, energetic, loyal and efficient, stands alongside her boss through the long hours of the day—and often in a stinky office—and fights tooth and nail with him the victory in the struggle for existence. How long would the petted wife last in this grueling battle with the world.

"So we have banded together to give our humble measure of service to our bosses. Within a year we expect our membership to total more than 4,000,000. We are enlisting hundreds every week."

Plans for a convention of Daytime Wives to be held in New York city in August are already under way. At that time, it is believed there will be more than 50 chapters in leading American cities and Boston is to be one of the first.

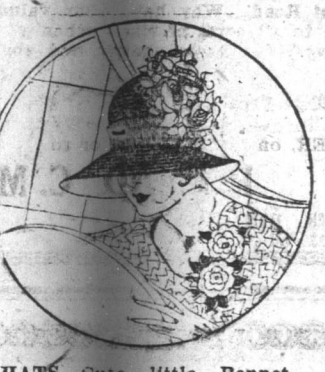
