### COMPENSATION **ACT CHANGES**

Victoria, Dec. 15 .- Changes in the Workmen's Compensation act introduced in the legislature today by Attorney General Manson provide:

1. That compensation shall be paid to injured workmen for the full period of their disability, provided that it lasts 14 days. This removes the previous three days' waiting period for which no compensation was paid, except that where the man is laid of for less than two weeks he still suf-fers the three days' loss.
