## TURKISH AGGRESSIONS

Ottoman Patrols in Central Sudan's Sphere Under French Influence

LONDON, Dec. 25.—A despatch to the Times from Dakar, West Africa, says: "An astonishing development of Turkish policy is reported from the east of Africa on the desert caravan route from Tripoli, through French territory to Northern Nigeria. By the Anglo-French agreement of 1899 the vast stretch of territory between the hinterland of Tripoli and Lake Chad lies within the sphere of French influence. The agreement was not recognized by Turkey and the Hamidian regime protested against this part of it at the time. Hence, it has been supposed for some little time by a French detachment in order to protect the caravan against the increasing boldness of the mounted pirates of the desert, the dissident Tuaregs and other nomads. Rumors of the presence of Turkish patrols in the present of the French were then current. Their accuracy has since been confirmed.

## PORTUGAL'S GOVERNMENT

Plan for New Republic Elaborated by Men Now in Charge—Based on French System

LISBON, Dec. 25.—The plan of government for the new Portuguese republic has been elaborated by the provisional government. It is based upon the parliamentary system of France, with certain modifications adapted from the United States. The president of the Portuguese republic will be chosen by the parliament for a term of five years, and he will be ineligible for re-election until a regular term has intervened.

Chilean War Vessel  
WASHINGTON, Dec. 25.—Bids for construction of two new Chilean battleships will be opened in London, January 10, and it is said the state department that prospects are favorable for securing a modification of the proposed contract so that British shipbuilders will not be given a particular advantage in the bidding over American interests. There has been no change, however, in the original plan which provides that the vessels must be bought in England.  
Freed of Murder Charge

Montross, the state contended, was shot while inside Kirk's saloon. It was the contention of the defence that the murder was committed outside the saloon by an unknown man who escaped.  
French Missionary Murdered  
HONGKONG, Dec. 25.—Father Morigol, who had been a French missionary in China since 1888, was murdered Thursday by natives in Yunghsi, in the province of Yunnan. An investigation into the case of the murder is proceeding. The district about Yunghsi is usually quiet.
