## ALLAN MILLER SR. DIES SUDDENLY

Went to Bathroom Saturday Evening and Expired

Campbellton was again called upon to mourn the sudden loss of another respected citizen in the death of Mr. Allan Miller Sr. of this town.

For some time deceased had complained of feeling unwell, but nothing serious was anticipated Saturday evening he did not feel well enough to partake of tea. Shortly after he went up stairs to the bathroom, being absent for an unusual time one of the members of the household went up and called to him, receiving no reply the door was forced open and he was found on the floor. Medical aid was summoned, but life had been extinct for some time.

Deceased who was 73 years of age, was born in Scotland, coming to this country when a young man and residing in Dalhousie until about ten years ago when he removed to Campbellton.

He is survived by four sons, William, Allan, James and George, all of Campbellton and three daughters, Mrs. Evertt Henderson, Mrs. J. E. Andrew and Mrs. William Cook all of this town.

The funeral was held from the home the afternoon of Tuesday afternoon and was largely attended. The service at the house and grave were conducted by Rev. T. P. Drumm. The pall-bearers were Robert, William and Thomas Craig, William and George Miller and John Muchie.
