OBITUARY

THOMAS W. ROBERTS - The death of Thomas W. Roberts occurred at his home at Dalhousie Junction, Jan. 29th after a lingering illness of the age of seventy-eight years. The Rev. W. Camp conducted the funeral services which were largely attended by relatives and friends of the deceased and interment took place in Dalhousie Cemetery.

MR. MARY IRVING - Mrs. Mary Irving, widow of the late Donald Irving died at her home in Flatlands, Wednesday, January 30th, 1924, after an illness of 15 days, at the age of 88 years.

MR. GALLON - A sad event took place on Jan. 21st 1924, at the home of Mr. Richard Gallon, when the loving father was called away to rest at the age of 71 years. The deceased had been in failing health for the past year.

SILVER FOX HUNTER - The New York auction sales Company announces an increase of ten per cent in the price of Silver Fox pelts as compared with September prices.

HEAVY FISH EATERS - This the people of Massachusetts are the champion fish eaters of the country, as indicated by figures which show that 56 per cent. of all the fish landed at Boston, which is the largest fishing port in the United States, is consumed in the Bay State.

CANADA'S FISHERIES - Ottawa, Jan. 31 - The harvest of sea fish in Canadian waters during December, 1923, totalled 649,419 net, and is valued at \$1,880,974 by the Department of Marine and Fisheries. There was a marked increase in the catch of cod, hake, herring, sand lance and salmon.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LEGISLATION - NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, at the next session, thereof, for an Act making provision for the completion of the union of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, the Methodist Church, and the Congregational Churches of Canada, to form the United Church of Canada; for the vesting of the general property of the said churches in The United Church of Canada; for the holding, management and administration of the property of congregations entering the said union, and for the holding of the property of congregations voting not to accept therein; for the transfer of the general and congregational property; and generally for the carrying of the said union into effect.

NEW CONSERVATIVE LEADER - J. B. Hickey for leader of the Conservative party in this province was chosen at a meeting held today by a group of Conservative workers who alleged that a movement with strong support was under way for the election of Mr. Hickey. Emphasis was laid on the advantage that would accrue from having a leader of Acadian Premier Veniot - St. John Globe.

SALES TAX - The New Brunswick government is proceeding to Ottawa against operation of the new sales tax as applicable to the purchase and distribution of school text books by the provincial government. The basis on which the protest is being made, Premier Veniot said, is that the distribution of text books throughout the province through the provincial bureau is a non-profit making arrangement for the benefit of the people.
