



Henry Allen to J.J. Dixon & Co.: The stock market opened strong to-day and moved upware gradually, due to London buying and the sympathy of the general list with the coalers, which scored the greatest advances. It was not a bit market. The interest was not materially increased, but it was an advancing market. The favorable conditions now obtaining in the financial circles of London were reflected in its operations. Herotofore London has had need for imoney and there has been little to invest. As it money and there has been little to invest. As its ioans are being returned and as the surplus is becoming larger it is natural that its funds should in part seek this market. The market must be assured that there are no obstacles in the way and it has clear sailing before the movement will be made, as if by word of command. At present there are some important uncertainties. Paris still continues to be the centre of attention, and until Paris arises out of the clouds that obscures it the general situation will not fully reflect the light which it is now dimly casting abroad.

Gossip from Chicago.

Kennet, Hopkins & Co. to R. Cochran: Cables were rather better than expected. Liverpool has been quite strong. December sold \$4560 on early curb, but when bell tapped it set loose a good many selling orders, the execution of which depressed market to \$4460. Clearances showed up well and late cables were higher. Yet market continued weak until shortly before the close, when it was announced via Minneapolis that Mr. Smith, United States Minister to Russia, had cabled from St. Petersburg that the long-looked-for Russian ukase had been signed. Immediately there was an advance of nearly a cent, with shorts covering freely. The market reacted \$460 when it was noised about that Minister Smith was in Philadelphia and could not have cabled an approach of the signing of the ukase. The drop in prices which followed was more rapid than had been the advance. It is quite generally believed here that the report is at least premature and probably a fake. Export engagements are unable to supply demand for cars, ware the Northwest, where it is said the railroads are unable to supply demand for cars, ware mouse and the remainder to come forward will exceed all expectations. It is feared by some that there may be some trouble in providing for the December deliveries, but there is little probability of such, when the May premium is almost full carrying charges. The elevator men would naturally prefer to hold grain in store and sell it for May.
