

Ottawa Wins Stanley Cup—Blanks Edmonton in Final; W.O.S.A. Girls Here To-Day

Ottawa Senators Capture World's Pro. Hockey Title

Defeat Edmonton Eskimos By 1 To 0 In Deciding Game Saturday Night—Champions Fight Way Through Three Play-Offs and Earn Laurels

VANCOUVER, April 1.—Ottawa Senators hold the world's championship. They fought their way through three play-offs to the honor which they earned if any team ever did. Defeating the Montreal Canadiens they came West and turned back the Vancouver Maroons, three games out of four. On Saturday night Senators defeated Edmonton Eskimos by the score of 1 to 0. The Senators got their lone score about halfway through the first period and from that point they played safe, but an unimpressive defensive game, which the Eastern rules allow. The Eskimos are one of the fastest teams in major hockey, but they were out of their element against the Senators.

The 7,000 fans who turned out to see the final game expressed their admiration for the fighting spirit which animated the Senators. At one time during the games with Vancouver or Edmonton were the Easterners at their full strength. Gerard's appearance last night was made at the cost of much pain to himself because of his injured shoulders. During the game he again received a severe wrench which forced him to retire. He was back into the fray in a few minutes. George Boucher played the first part of the game despite a badly cut foot, received in the first game.

The Senators triumphed over the West in the final game. The West has produced this season and they deserved their victory. It was a battle of speed and brilliant attack against experience, a heady calculation in every play, and a grim determination, and the latter won.

Last night's game was singularly clean throughout. Although eight penalties were handed out by Referee Ions—all two-minute ones. Each team received four-minute penalties. One of Ottawa's penalties was given to Benedict. Clancy filed the breach and Edmonton failed to score.

The crowd was about evenly divided between the desire to see the Senators triumph and their admiration for the grit of the Eskimos. The work of Simpson, Trapp, and the defense, was very fine. In last night's game Ottawa secured 21 shots on the goal, while the Eskimos had 14 in the first and 12 in the third. Edmonton scored in the 25th and 28th minutes.

Keats proved somewhat disappointing on the series play. Morrison, who substituted for him, showed more of the game and Arthur proved themselves fast and tricky players.

There is no denying that Ottawa possesses a wonderful team and one quite worthy of championship honors. They outplayed the Westerners, and their weight with telling effect in body-checking.

It was thought when the series opened that Ottawa was weak in spares. The work of Clancy and Hitchman throughout the series belied this report. The fact that Helman was removed from the games by an accident in the practice gave him little chance to show his worth. He played in the final game last night, however, very acceptably.

Everyone was agreed on the opinion that the Senators played and won under exceptional conditions. They are a great team, and their greatest strength is in action in the West. Western teams undoubtedly learn something from them in the matter of team work.

Individually the Vancouver team is quite as brilliant. But, welded into a whole, and working as a team, the Senators are probably without peers. The Canada-to-day, the world's championship remains in worthy hands.

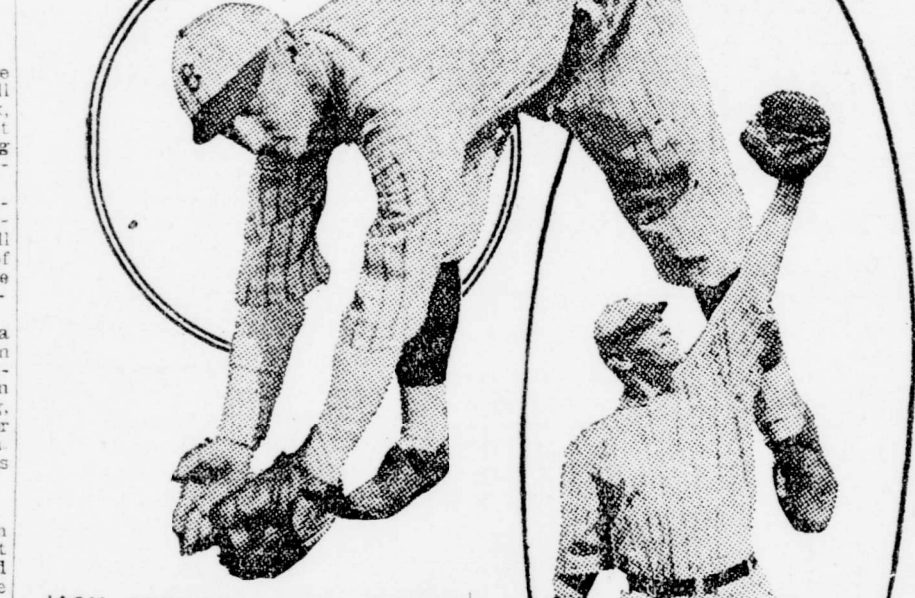

Peter Manning To Race At Windsor

World's Champion Trotter Will Appear For First Time In Race Since 1920

DETROIT, April 1.—Peter Manning (156½), world's champion trotter, will appear for the first time in a race since 1920 in the free-for-all trot, feature of the Blue Ribbon Driving Club's Grand Circuit meeting at Devonshire track, at Windsor, Ont., on October 2 to 8, if he has been announced here. The various stakes at Devonshire have attracted the largest list of entries ever recorded at a Canadian track. It is announced that the free-for-all trot, with a purse of \$5,000, will bring together as rivals of Peter Manning such horses as Char Worley, Lee Worley, Periscope and The Great Volt. The entry lists for this event number 14 names.

The M. and M. 208 trot, purse \$5,000, 24 entries; the Board of Commerce 208 pace, purse \$2,000, has 34 entries, while the D. and C. 212 trot, purse \$2,000, has 31 eligibles.

The Devonshire pace, for 3-year-olds, with \$1,000 added, has attracted 21 eligibles. The Blue Ribbon trot for 3-year-olds, with \$1,000 added money, has 25 eligibles. Up to July 4 virtually all of the stars of the harness world will be seen in action during the season.
