The following is the report: To the Wardens and Councilors: Your committee appointed to examine road returns beg leave to report that they have carefully looked over the returns placed in our hands, and find them more satisfactory than last year. The returns from some of the wards are all in, while others are behind. We are largely satisfied that the road work has been fairly well attended to.

FRIDAY MORNING. Council met at 10 o'clock. All Councilors present. Minutes read and approved.

Councillor Vidito gave notice of motion for re-consideration of the matter of purchase of the Bridgetown Court House.

The lists of Wardens for Wards Nos. 2, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, were read and adopted.

Resolved, That the Local Assessors travel from house to house to assess the property whereby to make up the Assessment Roll, and that each Councilor visit the Local Assessors of the Ward said Councilor represents.

Ordered, That Robert E. FitzRandolph, Joseph Hoop and Henry Munro be appointed as the Board of Revisors and continued under Chapter 2, Section 73, Local Act 1888.

The lists of Wardens for Wards Nos. 1, 3, 5, 6, were read and adopted.

Whereas, the Municipality of the County of Annapolis is entitled to be paid by the Western Counties Railway Co., under an agreement between the said Company and Her Majesty the Queen, represented by Hon. Samuel Croftman, then Commissioner of Public Works and Mines for the Province of Nova Scotia, and dated the 16th August 1879, interest on the amount of award for Railway damages for right of way from the 1st day of October 1879, until the said line of Railway from Annapolis to Digby is completed:

And whereas, the Treasurer of this Municipality received a letter from Collingwood Schroeder, Esq., Chief Engineer, under general manager of the Queen, representing the said award, dated July 24, 1889, requesting a statement of the amount due for interest as aforesaid:

And whereas, this Council has appointed a Special Committee to furnish the desired information and generally to do what may be necessary to secure payment of the amount due:

And whereas, a large sum of money is due to this Municipality for the interest aforesaid, and whereas it is a matter of the greatest importance to this Municipality that the same should be paid as soon as possible:

Therefore, be it resolved, That this Council request the presence of the Dominion Parliament, J. B. Mills, Esq., to bring the matter to the attention of the Dominion government, and to use every effort to secure a speedy settlement of the claim.

And, be it further resolved, That the Special Committee mentioned for mentioned forward a copy of this resolution to Mr. Mills and furnish him with all the information in the matter that can be obtained.

Upon reading the report of the Special Committee appointed to examine the bills in the Registry Office, the same was received and adopted. The following is the report: To the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Annapolis.

Ordered, That the Committee on Tenders and Public Property inform themselves as to place and cost of erecting a suitable look-up at Bridgetown and report at the April session.

Upon reading the report of the Committee appointed to investigate and report upon the accounts and report of the Inspector for enforcing the Scott Act the same was received and adopted.

The following is the report:—To the Warden and Councilors of the Municipality of Annapolis.

We have carefully examined the accounts of the present Inspector and find them correct, save and except the bill of Michael Riddison which we recommend to be reduced to \$8.

We find amount of costs to be \$190.00. Amount of costs to be \$172.41. Amount of costs to be \$407.18. Less amount received from W. J. Glenrose \$50.00.

Leaving a balance of acct. of \$809.18. Which amounts we recommend to be placed in the presentment.

We also find cases on which convictions have been obtained amounting to \$200. In view of the work accomplished by the Inspector in restraining the traffic in many sections of the County, we regret that the result of the year's work has not been a financial success, and your Committee would therefore recommend that the present Inspector be re-appointed until the April meeting of the Council on the same conditions as heretofore, and that in the interval the rate payers of the County be asked to express their views and wishes to this Council by petition or otherwise, and would urge upon the Inspector the necessity of prompt action in the cases now in suit.
