THE MASON EVAPORATOR.



N compliance with your request, I herewith submit a description of the Mason evaporator, made from memory. Size, 4x7x7 feet to eaves; frame made in three sections of 2x2 lumber, one at each end and one in the middle. I enclose the whole of one end with matched stuff, allowing the centre piece or board to extend one foot above the peak; cover the other end same way or within thirty to thirty-two inches of ground, that is the width of a piece of sheet iron. On the side, board to

within four inches of the ground ; this space is left on both sides for ventilation




FIG. 60.-THE MASON EVAPORATOR.

and draft of outside air. Slides for two single trays are made in this space under the heater. If draft of cold air is too strong, a strip of board is set against the opening on the windward side. The other side has first a six or
