* This sum was set apart to aid the Congregations of Rev. Messrs. McMaster of New Mills, Jack of Springfield and Englishtown, Gray of Norton and Sussex, Donald of Campbell Settlement and Londonderry, Millen of Beceabec and Waveig, and Fraser of Saltsprings and Golden Grove, all in New Brunswick and all requiring the fostering care of the mother church, and being essentially missionary in character. Besides the £80 stg. or \$400 Nova Scotia currency allocated to these as shown in the accounts, the sum of £80 stg., or other \$400, were by Mr. Bennet, under direction of the donors applied for the benefit of Fredericton and the new and strictly missionary congregation of Glassville and Florenceville. This sum being applied directly by Mr. Bennet does not appear in the Treasurer's accounts.
