## D. Special Issues

These tables provide statistics and information on various aspects of trade (for example, energy and agriculture) which are subject to negotiations and are not easily incorporated in the preceeding sections. In addition, reconciliation of Canadian and U.S. trade data are provided.

## E. Selected Statistics for Manufacturing Industries

Summary data for 23 industries are provided, these industries usually being those associated with a Sectoral Advisory Group on International Trade (SAGIT). Some of the data are based on the 1980 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC), and others on the 1970 SIC. The resulting discrepancies are usually negligible, except for clothing, knitting and textiles.

## F. Selected Statistics for Service Industries

Summary data for selected service sectors are likewise provided.

In addition to these data, there is a short reference section (G) in which the more important sources of data are provided.
