

Chile:

- In 1996, Canada exported just over \$753,000 worth of military supplies to Chile. A very small percentage -- just over \$1,000, consisted of firearms. The vast bulk were aircraft parts, and some aerial targets.
- However, the sale of so-called offensive weapons (small arms and weapons such as pistols, revolvers and rifles) are not sold to the Army, which will be commanded by Pinochet until March 1998.
- Canada and Chile also cooperate on hemispheric security-building measures and Chile's more active participation in UN peacekeeping operations.

Brazil:

- In 1996, Canada exported just over \$1.4 million worth of military goods to Brazil -- the vast majority aircraft and helicopter parts.

Argentina:

- In 1996, Canada exported just over \$9,500 worth of military goods to Argentina -- all of them firearms and parts.

Mexico:

- In 1996, Canada exported just over \$300,000 worth of military goods to Mexico, the vast majority of it ammunition, including some gas masks and parts.
