recently signed a two-year programme of academic, cultural and scientific exchanges for the period 1987-88. We are also fully

currently participating in the Vienna
Follow-Up Meeting that convened in November
to review the whole spectrum of CSCE
activitiy. If the CSCE process has known
certain frustrations and failures, it has
still been a most valuable forum for the
essential dialogue that must be continued
between East, West and the Neutral and
Non-Aligned. But to have success in the
CSCE, it is essential that each signatory
country respect their previous engagements,
engagements made by all the signatories to
the Helsinki Final Act. I will speak more
of this in a subsequent talk.

I would now turn briefly to mention the other components of Canada's security policy.
