PRAYERS.

The Clerk of the House laid upon the Table the Seventh Report of the Clerk of Petitions, stating that he had examined the petition presented on the 4th instant, and finds that all the requirements of Standing Order 68 have been complied with in this case. The said petition was then read and received, and is as follows:—

Of Marjorie Elizabeth Rae Dixon, of Montreal, Quebec; praying for the passing of an Act to declare her marriage with Cecil Dixon, of Cartierville, Quebec, to be dissolved, and that she be divorced from him.—*Mr. Bell (St. Antoine).*

Mr. Rhodes, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Second Annual Report of the Department of Fisheries (Sixty-fifth Annual Fisheries Report of the Dominion), for the fiscal year 1931-32.

He also laid before the House,—Statement of Returned Soldiers' Insurance, for the year ended 31st March, 1932.

Mr. Dupré, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of the 24th October, 1932, for a copy of all telegrams, letters, correspondence, exchanged between all persons, corporations, or others, and the Dominion Government, from January, 1931, to date, in connection with the lowering of pilotage rates on the St. Lawrence.

Mr. Gordon, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copies of Orders in Council passed under the provisions of the Unemployment and Farm Relief Continuance Act, 1932, as follows:—

Order in Council, P.C. 2422, dated 2nd November, 1932: authorizing payment to the Province of Alberta of \$728.50 for providing medical aid in Black Diamond and the Turner Valley District, to relieve distress of families located there, due to the cessation of operations in the oil industry.
