PRAYERS.

Mr. Baldwin, from the Standing Committee on Public Accounts, presented the First Report of the said Committee, which was read as follows:

Your Committee recommends:

1. That it be empowered to print such papers and evidence as may be ordered by the Committee, and that Standing Order 66 be suspended in relation thereto;

2. That its quorum be reduced from 15 to 10 Members, and that Standing Order 65(1)(e) be suspended in relation thereto.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Baldwin, seconded by Mr. Mc-Millan, the said Report was concurred in.

Mr. Wahn, from the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills, presented the Eleventh Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Your Committee has considered Bill S-7, An Act to incorporate The Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada, and has agreed to report it with the following amendments:

#### Clause 5, line 6, page 2:

Delete the following words: "and recognizable as the highest in Canada".

New sub-clause 10(1), line 37, page 3:

"Any licensing body which is not a participating licensing body may after the coming into force of this Act, if authorized by resolution, enter into an agreement with the Board to become a participating licensing body."
