PRAYERS

Mr. Reynolds, seconded by Mr. Munro (Esquimalt-Saanich), by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-359, An Act relating to the control and management of the water resources of Canada, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

Mr. Sharp for Mr. Whelan, seconded by Mr. Lang, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-28, An Act to amend the Animal Contagious Diseases Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure to amend the Animal Contagious Diseases Act to extend the application of the Act to provide for the payment of compensation for the destruction of sheep and compensation for animal products or animal by-products and, for other things destroyed under the Act as prescribed.

Mr. Ouellet, seconded by Mr. Lalonde, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-29, An Act respecting Canadian business corporations, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure respecting Canadian business corporations to provide for the appointment of a Director and one or more Deputy Directors, and to provide for matters in connection with the administration of the measure.

On motion of Mr. Sharp, seconded by Mr. MacEachen, it was ordered,—That the Public Accounts for the years ended March 31, 1972 and March 31, 1973 and the Reports of the Auditor General thereon, together with the evidence adduced by the Committee during the Twenty-ninth Parliament, be referred to the Standing Committee on Public Accounts.
