Mr. Church—On Tuesday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. What action does the Government propose to take regarding the huge loss of life on Canada's highways including those injured and the economic loss to Canada?

2. Are any amendments proposed to statute law this session to curb "hit and run" drivers, and other provisions?

Mr. Church—On Tuesday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. What were the military forces of Canada, of all kinds, as of November 1, 1940, in (a) Militia; (b) overseas; (c) air; (d) naval services?

2. How many divisions has Canada now fully equipped and drilled?

3. Are any more contemplated to enable Canada to co-operate and co-ordinate with Great Britain in taking the offensive on the axis powers in various theatres of war?

4. Was recruiting for overseas suspended during the thirty days and two weeks training under the War Service Act? If so, on whose recommendation?

5. What recruiting is now being carried on?

6. What military forces of all kinds has Canada now in Britain or in other European battle areas and how many officers and men from Canada are now overseas?

Mr. Coldwell—On Tuesday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. How many community pastures have been decided upon in the Prairie Provinces?

2. How many are in active operation?

3. How many acres do they comprise?

4. How many acres have been re-seeded to crested-wheat grass?

5. How many acres remain to be re-seeded?

6. How many cattle were pastured?

7. What was the total cost of fencing such pastures?

8. How many men are employed in the operation of the said pastures?

9. What is their average salary?

Mr. Reid—On Tuesday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. Was one Kurt Grunebaum and his brother Erich Grunebaum allowed to enter Canada some time late in 1939?

2. Were they granted an entry allowing them to settle in Canada indefinitely?

3. Were they allowed into Canada with the view of their going into business or with the view of obtaining a position or positions comparable to their previous training or experience?

4. What country were they nationals of, previous to their entry?

5. Did any person or persons act as sponsors for them, and, if so, who were they?

6. Before being allowed legal entry, were the Canadian authorities aware of their connections in Germany with any financial institutions in that country?

7. What was the exact date of their arrival to Canada?

8. Was one Erich Grunebaum employed by the Foreign Exchange Control Board? If so, what was the exact date of his employment, and the name of the person or persons recommending him for such employment?

9. What were his qualifications for such employment?
