"The investment of large sums of British capital will mean a great deal in the way of development of the agricultural resources of this province as several of my clients purpose using the land for colonization purposes," said Captain Hutton today to a representative of the Province. "This will mean the sending out of carefully selected people, many direct from the farms of their landlords. Apart from the favorable attitude of last year's visitors, the taxation measures of Rt. Hon. Lloyd George, chancellor of the exchequer, is contributing largely to the movement of the capital of landed proprietors abroad for investment purposes. Looking around they realize that British Columbia offers better and safer inducements than any other portion of the globe. There is no question that among this class British Columbia is regarded more favorably than any province of the Dominion."

Among the prominent Britishers for whom Captain Hutton has made investments are Captain Geoffrey Bowlby, adjutant of the Royal Horse Guards, and Sir Reginald Macleod. The
