

NEW YORK, Dec. 30.—(Can. Press.)
—Disturbed conditions in Mexico have forced the national railways of Mexico and the efficient properties to deforced the national railways of Mexico and its affiliated properties to default in the payment of interest due Jan. 1, on bonds amounting to \$111,000,000. E. N. Brown, president of the system, who made this announcement today, said that in lieu of the regular rach payments the company would is cash payments, the company would issue three-year six per cent. notes. The bonds on which default is de-clared consist of \$84,000,000 of Na-tional Railways 4½ per cent. prior liens, \$26,000,000 of National Railroad 4½ per cent. prior liens, and \$1,374,000 of Mexican Central Railway 5 per cent. priority bonds. Semi-annual interest on these issues aggregate approxi-mately \$2,500,000.
