## TABLE OF STAMP DUTIES.

n every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, not more than \$25, 1 cent; over \$25, 50, 2 cents; over \$50 to \$100, 3 cents.

n every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, executed singly, for the first \$100, 10 every additional \$100, or fraction of a \$100, 3 cents.

n every draft or bill of exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, 10 exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every draft or fraction thereof.

y additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.

my auditional for bill of exchange executed in more than two parts, for each part for the \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

the duties to be paid by stamps affixed to each promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange: the person affixing such stamp shall, at the time of affixing the same, write or stamp ten the date at which it is affixed, and each stamp shall be held prima facie to have affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and, if no date be so stamped or written eon, such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.

## LETTER RATES.

METTER RATES, ETC.

Canada.—Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Dominion (includ-Manitoba, British Columbia and Prince Edward Island) pass, if prepaid, for 3 cents per oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 5 cents per 1/2 oz. Letters mailed at any ce for delivery by or from that same office, are charged 1 cent each, and must be prepaid, erwise they are sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Newfoundland.—Postage on letters 6 cents per ½ oz. Newspapers 2 cents each. Pre-

yment necessary.

Bermuda (via Halifax).—Letters 6 cents per ½ oz. Newspapers 2 cents each. Printed

itter 6 cents per 4 oz.

United States.—The rate on letters to the United States is 6 cents per ½ oz. if prepaid, cents if unpaid. Newspapers 2 cents each.

Great Britain and Ireland.—The rate on letters to the United Kingdom by Canadian

ail Steamers is 6 cents per 1/2 oz. if prepaid; if posted unpaid or partially paid, they will charged, on delivery, with the amount of deficient postage and a fine of three pence ster-ng each letter. By Cunard or other steamers sailing from ports in the United States to ngland the rate is 8 cents per 1/2 oz.

POST CARDS WITHIN THE DOMINION AND TO AND FROM THE UNITED STATES.

Postal Cards circulate in the Dominion at 1 cent each. An additional 1 cent stamp must affixed when addresed to the United States. Unless so paid they will not be forwarded. ostage Cards from the United States, when prepaid 2 cents, will be delivered without rther charge.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting letters containing value, should register them, and obtain from the Post laster a Certificate of Registration. The charge for Registration, in addition to the postage, is as follows:

PARCEL POST.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Dominion, 12/2 cents per 8 oz., (with 5 cents additional if Registered.)
