Name of Jelus Chrift. Thus will our Joy be confectated, and turned into a Sacrifice ; a " spiritual Sacrifice, acceptable to God by Jefus Chrift". And the facred Pleafure will be gradually increased by daily renewed Thanksgivings and Praises .- Only, at the fame Time, " let our Conversation be as becometh the Gospel", that by our obedient Lives, as well as joyful and thankful Lips, we may teftify ourDelight inGod, and prove theSincerity of ourGratitude to Him. Surely the Call of Heaven to us at this Day is in fuch Language as that (1 Sam. 12.24.) "Only fear the Lord, and ferve him in Truth : for confider how great Things be hath done for you. Or, that (Pfal. 2. 11.) Serve the Lord with Fear, and rejoyce with Trembling. As God has been doing great Things for us, furely he expects great Things from us, in a way of practical Returns. And be it remembred, He that has done great Things for us, the fame can also do great Things against us. We see, his almighty Hand can bring about great Changes in a little Time. And when we reflect on the Mutability of human Affairs, together with our Unworthiness of Divine Favours, and our Defert of Judgments, it becomes us to "rejoyce with Trembling." In unspotted Justice, God might have made our Enemies to rejoyce over us : and he may do it still. What can we expect, but the Tokens of his Displeasure, in this or some other tremendous Way, unless his Goodness effectu. ally leadeth us to Repentance !

To our Praifes therefore let us add our *Prayers*, that Profperity may be fanctify'd to us, and made a prevailing Argument with us, from a Senfe of Ingenuity & Gratitude, to ferve the LORD with Gladnefs. Let us pray, that the Spirit may be poured from on high, to reftore Religion to a profperous and victorious State. Let us implore a Divine Bleffing on theKing'sCounfels and Efforts, for a fafe and advantageous Peace. But above all the Son of God may be advanced; that the Kingdom of the Son of God may be advanced; that the Conquelts of his Power & Grace over the Souls of Men may fpread through the World; that there may be Glory to God in the highest, Peace on Earth, and Goodwill towards Men.
