

preceding rule shall be styled privileged members, and, as such, shall enjoy all the rights of ordinary members but that of voting and being elected members of Committee.

ART. 14.—Every candidate proposed as a privileged member, shall be stated to be so on the list of candidates for election, which is posted in the Coffee Room; no candidate to be a privileged member shall be placed on the said list, unless with the consent of the Committee previous to posting. Any stranger *not a resident of the Province*, upon the introduction of a member, and the unanimous sanction of the Committee at any General or Special Meeting, may be admitted to all the privileges of the club upon payment of an entrance fee of \$10 for any period under one month, \$20 for any period over one month and not exceeding three months, and \$30 in all if he continue for the whole year.

ART. 15.—Any member shall have the privilege of introducing a friend to breakfast, lunch, or dine in the Stranger's Room, at his sole expense; and no stranger shall be admitted at any time, except into the Stranger's Room, Smoking Room and Drawing Room, unless to view the house, and then accompanied by a member; Provided always, that any stranger dining with a member may be introduced by him to the Billiard-Room, and be permitted to play at the tables on the day he shall have dined with such member at or after six o'clock P. M., on that day, and provided that no stranger shall at any time be admitted into the Cara Room.
