## MONTREAL PRO. LEADS FOR OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP

Keffer of Ottawa Second, With Kenny, North Toronto, and Cummings, Toronto, Tied For Third.

OTTAWA, July 7.—Charlie Murray, the professional of the Royal Montreal Golf Club, leads as the result of the first day's play in the open championships at the Royal Canadian tournament, on the links of the Ottawa Golf Club. Karl Keffer, the Ottawa professional, is second, having completed the two rounds in 156, while Dan Kenny, now of North Toronto, who won the championship last year, and Geo. Cummings of Toronto, are tied for third place. Keffer, who is just four strokes behind Murray, is regarded by many as the probable champion. George Cummings and Dan Kenny, who finished yesterday the greatest game of the day, finished on equal terms, with 156. Curiously enough, they made both rounds in 28 each.

Mr. Evans, the Boston amateur, who is known as one of the longest drivers in the United States, made the first round in 58 and the second in 58. The third round starts at 9 o'clock in the morning, and the grand aggregate on the two days will close at 5 o'clock in the afternoon. The fourth and final round starts at two to-morrow afternoon, and the tournament will close at a close to-morrow evening. The competitors will pair off in the same order as to-day. 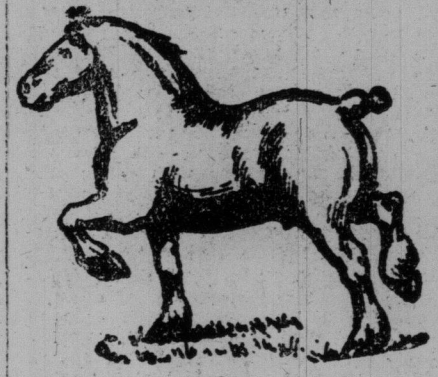

## Measuring Raindrops.

Mr. Spencer C. Russell, at a meeting of the Royal Meteorological Society, described how he obtained records of the actual size of raindrops. He said the experiments had led him to conclude that the most satisfactory results were given by the use of plaster of Paris or fine hour glass in three-inch shallow trays to a depth of one and one-half inches. Raindrops striking thunderstorms had been registered yielding a total of 161 drops, divided into the following sizes: Two and five of 5 millimeters, 40 of 4 millimeters, 48 of 3 millimeters, 33 of 2 millimeters, and 12 of 1 millimeter. The largest drops occurred at the commencement of the storm, grading off as the storm progressed. Before a fall of half a marked increase in drop size was apparent.—London Evening Standard.
