Birds Bang Justin All Over the Lot, and Leafs Lose Two in Row.

Baltimore, June 17.—The Birds made it two in a row from the Leafs this afternoon when they romped home easy winners, 6 to 2. The Birds got away to an early start, and were never headed after they slammed Justin All over the lot in the third round. Justin, who beat the Birds in every start against them thus far this season, was handled in decidedly rough fashion, and with Worrell twirling there was little danger of the Leafs crawling up.
