There will just be the one familiar bottle for each prescription, no matter how bad the insomnia may be, how weak the heart or how excruciating the rheumatic pains.

Doctors on Black List

It is also given out that eight doc-tors in and around Toronto have incurred the displeasure of the Ontario License Board for too promiscuously issuing prescriptions and their orders will not in future be honored by the government, vendors. They will remain on the black list until they have convinced the license authorities that they will be less generous with their thirsty patients.

The increase in the price for Canadian whisky recently imposed by the license board has not had any detrimental effect on the demand, while the supply continues good.
